


AVATAR is a statewide network of **regional partnerships**, focused on secondary and postsecondary **vertical alignment**, to support students' **college and career readiness and success**.

AVATAR is a Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) funded project that is implemented by the North Texas Regional P-16 Council and the University of North Texas.






















Educational Attainment: 2010






Texas Public 4 Year University Pipeline: Fall 2005 Cohort



Public Universities – 58,183



The Vertical Alignment Process & Outcomes


Regional Partners:

- 1. Establish shared regional college and career readiness **foundation/understandings**
- 2. Use **regional data** to guide decision-making
- 3. Design and implement a **vertical alignment action plan** including **critical conversations**
- 4. Design and implement a **sustainability plan**
- 5. Prepare students for **college and career** readiness and success



Phase Three: **The Statewide Network**

At this time, **188 individuals** that represent 82 postsecondary institutions, P-16 councils, service centers, and districts were trained and are now implementing the AVATAR process throughout 13 regions in Texas.



<u>Thumbnail Sketch of</u> <u>Region 16 ESC Schools</u>

- There are **62 public school districts** and **two charter schools** in the top 26 counties of the Texas panhandle
- Individual districts range in size from fewer than 50 students to more than 32,900 students
- **49 of the 62** school districts have student enrollments of **less than 1,000 students**
- 50 of the 62 districts are considered rural



<u>Selecting Your Vertical</u> <u>Alignment Team</u>

Original Team Consisted of:

- Two Higher Education Math Faculty
- One High School Math Teacher
- One ESC Instructional Services Director
- One ESC/P-16 Specialist





One team member represented the second-largest high school in the region

HOWEVER...

The student demographics and academic performance of that high school **would not be representative** of high schools in the region

SO...

We planned to include data from **all** high schools in the region in an effort to promote buy-in for the project from regional schools



<u>Selecting Your Vertical</u> <u>Alignment Team (cont)</u>

BUT...

We realized very quickly that the data would be **overwhelming**

ALSO...

While the HS represented on the team fed the fouryear IHE represented, **no** students from that HS went to the two-year IHE represented





There are 4 IHEs in the region:

- West Texas A&M University (4-year)
- Amarillo College (2-year)
- Clarendon College (2-year)
- Frank Phillips College (2-year)

Three of the region's larger high schools feeding the IHEs chose to participate:

- Amarillo HS
- Borger HS
- Canyon HS




<u>Selecting Your Vertical</u> <u>Alignment Team (cont)</u>



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
How Do We Grow our Students to Be More College Ready?

- Team members keep their focus on students' needs, allowing for adjustment as needed.



How to Develop an Action Plan to Sustain AVATAR Work?

- Develop measurable short and long term goals.
- Determine *benchmarks* and create *norms* to hold one another accountable to achieving them.
- Plan for a *product* as an outcome of every meeting.




How to Develop an Action Plan to Sustain AVATAR Work?

- Build *flexibility* into your plan to allow the work to meet the students' needs in the pipeline.
- **Communicate** goals and action items at every meeting.
- Engage an *advisory council* (formal or informal) to prioritize AVATAR beyond meetings.



Suggestions from Our Partners to Sustain the Work:

- Work with partners to build a **business plan for 3-5 years**.
- Collaborate with similar groups in the spirit of cooperation not competition.



 Engage community partners in education and business to build systemic relationships.
